CABIN LEADER/PARENTS

Except for group activities ALL cabins are on their own.

It is the responsibility of the CABIN LEADERS with the assistance of PARENTS:

*To collect food or money (\$3.00-\$6.00 per person) for breakfast and snacks. Arrange the meals, schedule activities, encourage participation and to have FUN!

Splitting up the responsibilities for cooking, dishes and cleaning usually works the best.

*Please make sure ALL are in agreement on the menu and take note of any special dietary situations.

Remember if you are going to have a campfire you will need wood and matches. You may also want hotdogs and/or smores to eat.

Cabin Leaders to arrange with parents/scouts to bring in own pots, pans, utensils, dish soap, coffee maker, & place settings (paper products preferred)

Cabin Leaders need to inspect cabins upon arrival to ensure cabins are in good condition (complete Cabin Check-in Checklist). Report any damage to the Ranger.

Cabin Leaders are responsible for going through the check out procedure on Saturday, and completing it by 2:00 P.M. Ranger will be by to check cabins and pick up cabin checklist and keys.

PARKING: Only 2 Vehicles are allowed to park in front of each cabin and this should be the cabin leaders. Roadway shall be clear at all times for emergency use. All other vehicles need to park in the main parking lot adjacent to the Cub Scout Dining Hall. Cabin Leaders/Parents can drop off their camping equipment/supplies at their respective cabins prior to parking in the main parking lot.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

Cabins are equipped with the following:

- *Heat
- *Kitchen w/Refrigerator
- *Double kitchen sink
- *Two first floor rooms for Cabin Leaders and/or Moms (Frontier Fort, Trapper Village, And Indian Village)
- *One room for Cabin Leaders and/or Moms (Lodge #1, Lodge #2, And Enterprise)
- *All Cabins have a loft area with mattresses on floor
- *Scenic views of Michigan's wilderness and wildlife!
- *Bathroom/Showers
- *Stove
- *Vacuum and floor cleaning supplies

ACCOUNTABILITY:

Please be sure each member in your cabin knows what is on the agenda. Posting of the agenda in the cabins would be a good way to communicate the plan of the day. Everyone needs to work as a team! Scouts should buddy up with the Cabin Leaders/Parents having periodic head counts. Keep in mind two-Deep Leadership and never let any scout or scouts out of sight without adult supervision! Cabin Leaders may choose to have a sign in/out slip to know who is where and when at all times.

IMPORTANT (ADULTS):

No Alcohol is allowed on site or any scout function (e.g. Bowling). Smoking is permitted as long as it is outside and out of line of sight of the scouts.
